

Safety

School on Wheels Policies

- Be familiar with the rules & regulations and follow them at all times.
- Always wear your School on Wheels badge to identify yourself.
- Always check in with facility staff as soon as you arrive.
- Never enter a student's bedroom.



Safety

My Personal Tips

- Take time to say hello to everyone who is around.
- Pay close attention to your body language and tone of voice.
- If possible, find a quiet workspace.
- Keep your physical distance.
- Make sure your student understands why you are there.
- Be consistent.
- Give it time!

- Spend time with your student every week
- Listen
- Ask questions
- Manage your own expectations


Dealing with Disappointments

Advocating

Who are the adults in my student's life?

- Social worker
- Parole officer (P. O.)
- CASA (Court Appointed Special Advocate)
- Therapists
- Teachers
- Trustworthy family members
- Facility directors and staff
- Other adult mentors



Advocating

How do I reach out to these people?

- Establish a good relationship with the facility directors and staff
- Keep your School on Wheels RC updated
- Contact your student's social worker/case manager
- Get permission to go with your student to meet with teachers
- Bring in resources for your student
