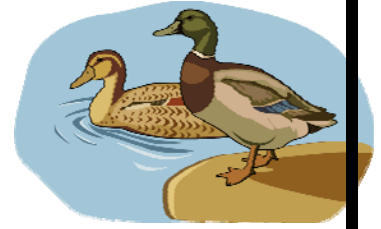

## Correlative Conjunctions

**Correlative Conjunctions** are pairs of conjunctions that work together. Like mallard duck, you will always find Correlative Conjunctions in pairs!



**EXAMPLES:** both/and, either/or, neither/nor, not only/but also, whether/or
