

















City C and Country C



C can make two sounds. If the vowels **e** or **i** come after the **c**, then **c** will have the **s** sound. If one of the other vowels (**a**, **o**, **u**) comes after the **c**, then **c** will have the **k** sound.

Look at the pictures and words on this page. If it begins with an **s** sound, as in *city*, circle **s**. If it begins with a **k** sound, as in *country*, circle **k**.
