

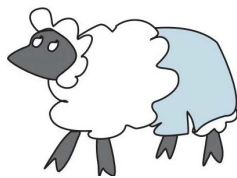

Can you say, "shhh"?

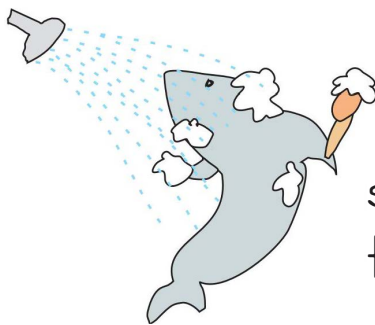
We have lots of words that make

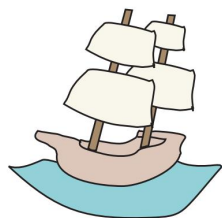
We don't have a letter in the alphabet for the "sh" sound, so we have different ways of writing it.

You can't actually hear an "s" or an "h," but that is how we write it.

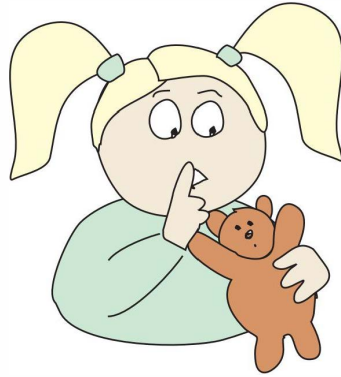

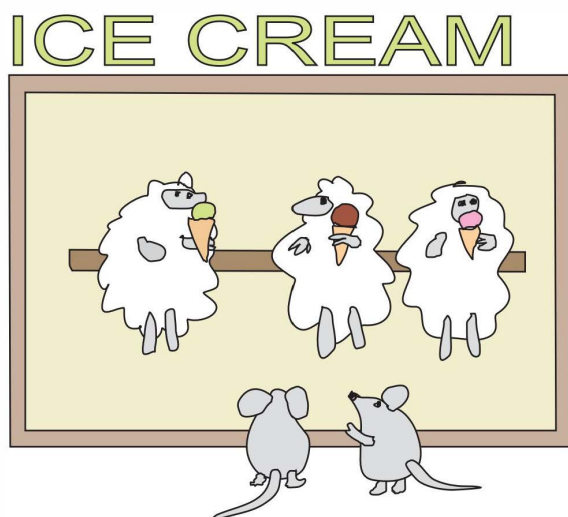

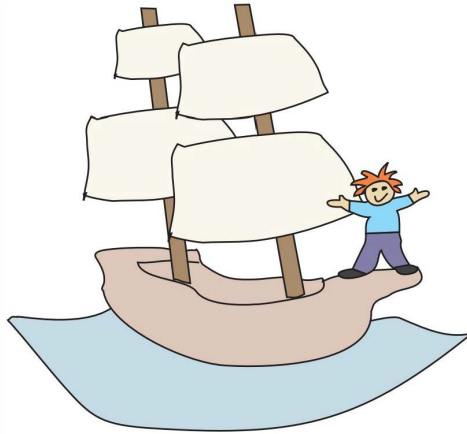
