



Mission Statement

About Our Students

The national graduation rate for unhoused students is 13 percentage points below their low-income peers and 18 percentage points below all students. Not only is this vulnerable group less likely to graduate, but those without a high school diploma are 4.5 times more likely to experience homelessness as young adults.

We provide our students with trusted adults who teach, mentor and assist their educational lives and provide a regular environment of reinforcement, positive modeling and constructive feedback.



School on Wheels spends 92 cents of every dollar donated on student programming. In 2022, we maintained another year of strong financial stability.


